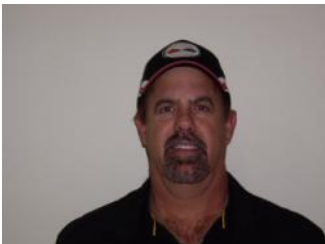

Tech Tips By Dave Frederick

Oil Pressure Sender



If you see your oil pressure gauge look like the one in the picture you have been bit by the notorious C5/ LSX oil pressure sensor bug. Same as some other parts this is prone to failure. The symptoms may be intermittent at first but will become permanent. Usually it will peg and after some time will drop to zero. Don't worry it is still safe to drive until you get it fixed. The biggest problem is it takes the dealer or mechanic 3-4 hours to do it at a cost of \$400. I am all for DIY if you can and here are your options.

- 1 Take it to the dealer
2. Do it yourself by removing the intake.
3. Do it by cutting a hole in the wiper cowl
4. Do it without any of the above.



Option 1 is self explanatory open you wallet wide. If you have some mechanical ability and tools option 2 is very doable. You will need the new sensor (some say the brass BWD brand is the best replacement) a socket set and a torque wrench. Here is a link for a step by step guide.

Pretty daunting huh? If you do not have a FSM (factory service manual available from Helm Inc. or on eBay) for

your year for the proper torque and can use it, it can be. Some who use this method actually re pipe it so it can be replaced easily later. If you can find it there are some relocation kits out there

Option 3 <http://forums.corvetteforum.com/1558642196-post62.html>

is easier and requires removal of the wipers and screen cover to get inside the wiper cowl. A hole needs to be cut over the sensor. Use a license plate or similar to prevent cutting into anything under it. Remove the clip from the Ops (a wire or coat hanger may help) and use a socket with a little tape inside to remove and hold the Ops. Reverse the process and torque it to (I think) 15ftlbs. The problem with this method is now you have to come up with a way to plug the hole. Some use duct tape others use some plastic glued with silicon. What ever you do it will not be seen after re installing the cover but needs to be able to withstand water.

Option 4 is to use swivels and small hands to reach it from the top driver side of the engine. Don't think it can be done? Go to <http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=5PvIDLcyXX8> . The only problem I see here is getting the right torque but 15ftlb is just a hair past tight. I suspect some dealer mechanics do it this way and charge you the amount listed in their books to do it which is 3 1/2 hrs. NOOO a dealer would never do that to you would they?

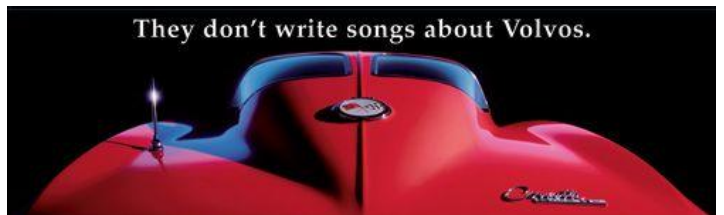
